

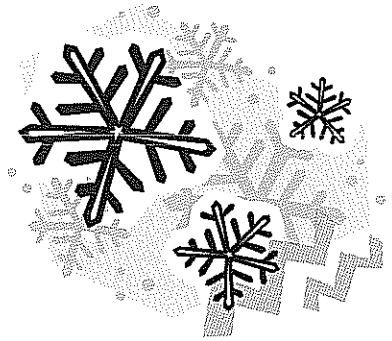

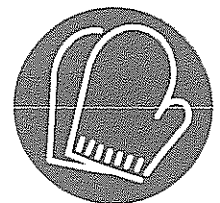

By making math fun with games and activities, students will enhance skills taught during the school day.

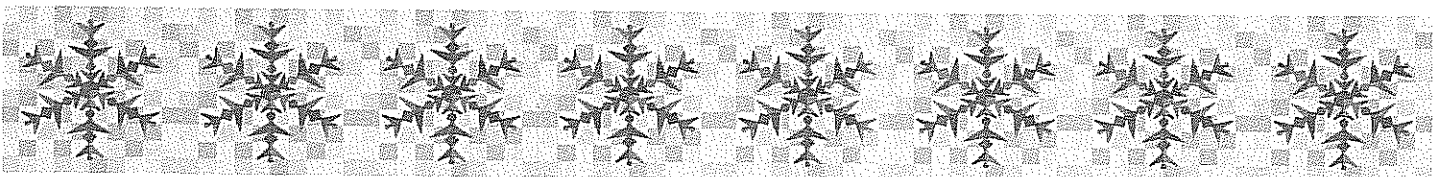
*Knitting—Ms. Marie (limit 10 students)
